Known US covert drone strikes: **Yemen 2002 - 2012**

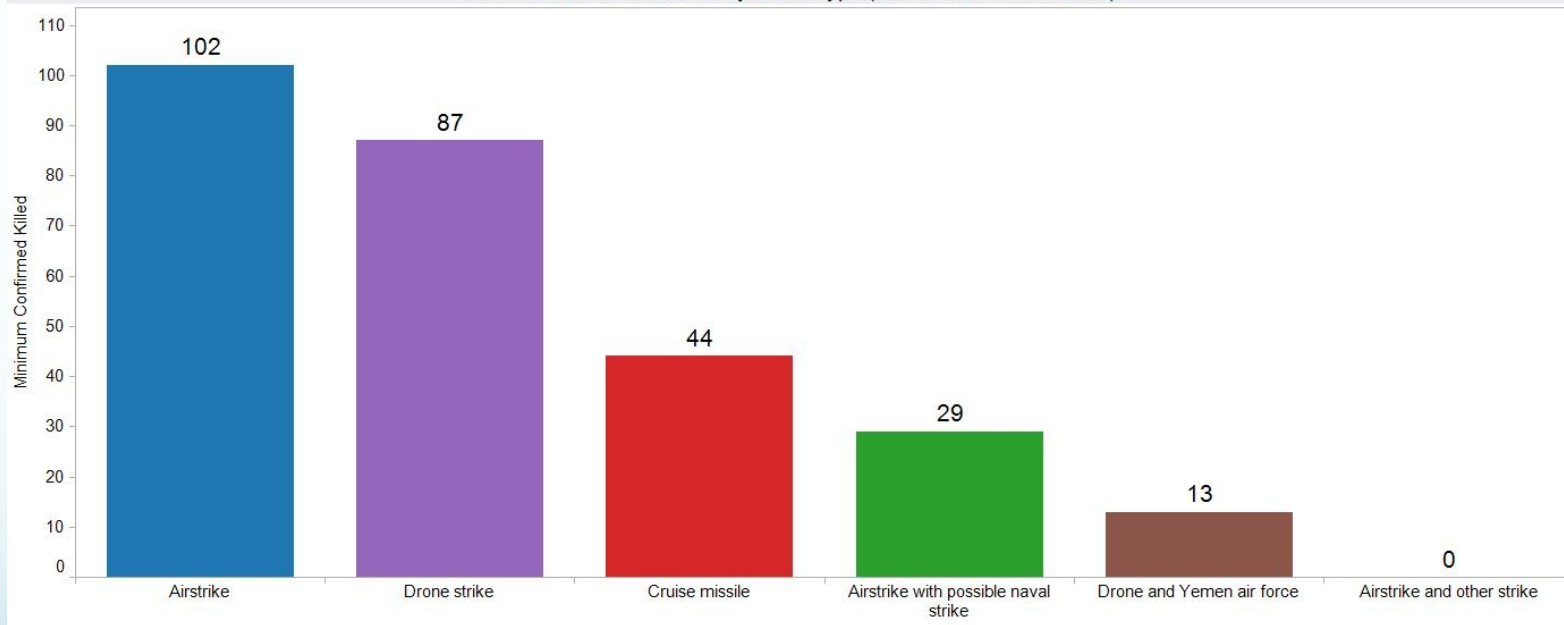


- Total US drone strikes: 20-88

"He was living in a small rented house with his wife and children in Miranshah. **He, his wife and two other members of his family died on the spot,**" a Pakistani Taliban commander told Reuters. He declined to be identified. Pakistani intelligence officials said the death toll could rise because buildings next to the one targeted were also damaged and people could have been there.

When facts get spun



Investigation examines 10 highest death-toll strikes in Pakistan since summer 2010.

Based on 80 eyewitness statements, reports that of 194 people killed in the strikes, 56 are civilians

In two of ten events AP turns up previously-unreported civilian casualties.

All deaths occur during period CIA says 'no non-combatants killed'

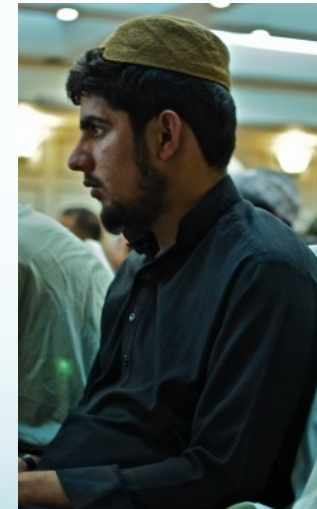
