Hancock 38 Trial, November 1st

At a pre-trial hearing on Wed, Aug. 24, a trial date was set for the Hancock Drone Resisters. The trial stems from arrests following a civil disobedience action at the main entrance of Hancock Air National Guard Base on April 22, 2011, where 38 people were arrested at a die-in protesting the drones at the Base (see photo). We don't know how long the trial will last – the judge has cleared several evenings for it.

Motions were also argued at the hearing — the defendants argued that they should be entitled to use the necessity defense (it is ok to break a law in order to prevent something worse from happening) and bring in testimony about the illegality of drone warfare. Both motions were denied.
